Purpose Statement

To build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

Residency Program Facts

- First community-hospital pharmacy residency program in Kentucky
- Designed to produce a solid foundation in the provision of pharmaceutical care, practice management, and essential skills
- Residents are actively involved in improving patient care
- Program is individually tailored to the resident's strengths and the areas in which improvement is needed
- Core learning experiences include: Orientation, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Critical Care, Surgery, Infectious Disease, Ambulatory Care, and Pharmacy Practice Management
- Longitudinal experiences include: Policy Development, Committee Involvement, Medication
